## New School at Shoppes at Taylor Ranch


Walking into 4801 Montano Drive, Ste A-2, located at The Shoppes at Taylor Ranch, the first thing you note is 90 or so students intently working at their individual computer stations. These students, seriously absorbed in their work seemed undisturbed by visitors.

The Creative Education Preparatory Institute # 1 (#2 is located at 69 Hotel Drive NE) is a Charter High School under the APS Umbrella open and free to students who need an alternative to traditional high school classrooms. Thomas Crispin, Director and Co-Founder, states that the school in it's first year of operation is already at 90% capacity of the maximum allowed 100 students per half-day session with a waiting list. Students are chosen through a lottery system so everyone has an equal opportunity. These students come from the Cibolla, West Mesa and Rio Grande Traditional High Schools. The Student-Teacher Ratio at CEPI #1 is 20:1.

# Trash Recycle - Every Week Starting Jan

We soon won't have to worry about storing our recycle trash for two weeks. Albuquerque's Solid Waste Division will resume weekly pickup of recycle materials as of January 2005. In other refuse news, if you didn't notice, the convenience centers have been open seven days a week, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. since July. These are the locations you can bring a pickup truck load of trash and yard debris for under \$4. Remember, no trailers, no tree limbs in excess of 8 feet, and all the convenience centers are closed Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's Day. See trna.org or cabq.gov for more information.®

As a technology-based school, it has a highly sophisticated "Smart Lab" consisting of four computer stations containing software where students can learn about many subjects and skills. There are hands on experiments as well, one of which is a hydroponics laboratory ready and waiting to grow out-of-season vegetables. Mr. Crispin describes the school as one where a student can 'discover learning' or the secondary equivalent of the Montessori primary schools. ®

## **History Corner No. 4**

A Brief History of Marie M. Hughes **Elementary School**

Marie M. Hughes Elementary School (5701 Mojave ) was named after Dr. Marie M. Hughes, professor emeritus at UNM. She retired in 1974 from UNM. She had joined the UNM faculty after earlier distinguished careers at the universities of Utah and Arizona. Marie M. Hughes Elementary School opened in August 1979 with 12 portable classrooms plus an administration building. The projected enrollment was 243 students. By August 28, 1979, the enrollment was 389 students. That same year, in November, construction started on Phase One: 2 kindergarten classrooms, counselor's office, resource room, library, teacher workroom lounge, and cafeteria. The enrollment in August of 1980 was 467 students. In September 1980 construction started on Phase Two: 17 classrooms, music room, landscaping and playground. By August 1981 the school enrolled 505 students and the principal was Harold J. Mercer. The building was dedicated on Sunday, October 18, 1981. (Thanks to Rita Rincon and Karyl Farris who provided this information.) Today the enrollment is 750 and the principal is Jami Jacobson.

A related tidbit from the TRNA files: "Jim McCutchen, Bellamah Corp, informed TRNA that the bridge to Marie Hughes Elementary school is scheduled to be completed by March 1981." ®
