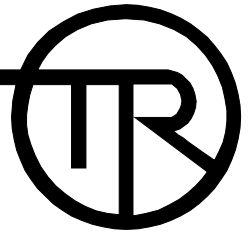

Land Use Update

1. Bus Rapid Transit Study Public Meeting: On February 23rd at Cibola High School, the Rio Metro Regional Transit District hosted the first of a series of public meetings to look at the transportation system for

the Westside. The meeting focused on Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) along the Paseo Del Norte Corridor between Unser and I-25. Right now an average morning or evening commute between Golf Course and I-25 takes approximately 20 minutes. Within the next 20 years the same trip is expected to take approximately 45 minutes. Most of the population growth is on the west side and the employment growth is on the eastside. There are no plans to construct any new bridges or widen existing river crossings. The goal of this meeting was to improve transit services from the northwest mesa to the Journal Center, the Rail Runner station in Los Rancho's, the Downtown district, UNM, and the Hospital areas. The transit study will look at different transit options. A slide show presentation showed different transit systems. One system, known as the BRT Guide-way System is being used in other Countries. This system uses regular buses which travel on a special guide-way lane, using a curb barrier to separate it from regular traffic. These buses can also travel on regular traffic lanes. To view the presentation, go to the web site: nmrailrunner.com, and then search for "BRT" study. Several comments were taken after the slide presentation. One man said he didn't

want to pay any more taxes to pay for mass transit. Another man said he supported mass transit. He pointed out that taxpayers already paid a lot of money for new roads and bridges, but with the anticipated increase in west side population and the limited access to the east side of Albuquerque, the quality of life will deteriorate unless there is an increase in mass transportation. Other comments included the need for more bridges, a need for regional transit planning with Rio Rancho, and the need for more designated park and ride areas for transit users, especially along Coors Blvd. It is unfortunate that by tolerating unconstrained development on the Westside, and allowing this expansion without the necessary transportation corridors in place to handle the additional traffic, we are allowing the City of Albuquerque and Rio Rancho's poor planning practices to undermine our quality of life.

2. Trash Dumping on the mesa: Recently, while on a hike along the escarpment, I discovered several sites where illegal trash dumping occurred. I called Diane Souder, Chief of Outreach for the National Park Service about this garbage. Patsy Rippo, TRNA President, and I took a drive with Diane to look at the situation. Unfortunately, we discovered more dump sites along the Monument boundary. Some of the trash is from households and some of it appears to be construction debris. It has been dumped on private and public land and is blowing onto the escarpment. The National Park Service and Open Space are responsible for cleaning up trash on public land. Diane Souder is planning to organize a clean up effort with City Open Space to remove the trash in and near the public land. If she needs volunteers to help in the clean up effort, I will send out an e-mail with the contact information. Illegal dumping needs to be addressed right away before it gets worse. To report illegal dumping, call 311. Residents can dump trash at any of Albuquerque's Convenience Centers. Albuquerque also has a free pickup service to pickup large household items. The City's 311 information number can provide you the location of the nearest convenience center and can assist you in arranging for a pickup service. We all have a responsibility to keep our environment clean. land@trna.org ®

The Westside Coalition of Neighborhood Associations met March 3.

The week before this meeting, an issue had come up through email regarding a split of the Coalition, by

forming new coalitions along city council district lines. Some emails expressed concern that the Coalition was not effective because it did not follow council district lines. Other emails stated that anyone could form any group or coalition they want, which need not risk the effectiveness or existence of a larger group like the current one. Many coalition members and visitors expected debate on this issue at the meeting, but President Laura Horton announced that a second March meeting for members only would be held March 31 to discuss the issue. The public is apparently not invited. I will be there to represent the interests of Taylor Ranch.

Antonio Sandoval, representing Congress Heinrich, announced that the congressman will be hosting a job fair March 8. He also informed the attendees that there is now a Veteran Services Guide available. Contact the congressman's office if you would like one.

Albuquerque Fire Chief James Breen reported that the administration is considering moving Fire Station 7 near 57th and Central. A new station, number 23, to be located near Volcano Vista High School, is in the development phase. APD, Open Space, the Park Service, AFD, and the Sheriff's Department are cooperating to patrol the bosque during the fire season. The public is encouraged to stay

alert and to report anything suspicious. Like every year, Fourth of July patrols will be increased. There were praises regarding these patrols last summer.

APD Commander Warfield reported that burglaries have been significantly reduced in the last three years. Auto burglaries are down 49 percent, and stolen vehicles have decreased 35 percent.

Long-time Westside APD Commander Conrad Candelaria just retired. The Coalition presented him with an thank you plaque and a cake was served in his honor.

Tito Madrid, representing the mayor's office, reported that there are still many openings on boards and commissions. Anyone interested in servicing should visit the city's website for details.

A representative from Presbyterian conducted a presentation on the new hospital being built in Rio Rancho, near Unser and Westside Drive.

District 5 Councilor Dan Lewis announced a meeting for district constituents to be held on March 23. He also announced that construction of Unser, from Boca Negra to Paseo del Norte is scheduled to begin by the end of summer this year.

volcanoes are) and from Paseo del Norte to Western Trail/ Namaste. At our last meeting we concluded that such a big area is not workable with 26 active patrol members. Since patrol members use their own cars and pay for their own gas, they naturally prefer to patrol more or less within their own areas. Therefore we decided to temporarily suspend patrolling in the areas north of Calle Norteña, west of Unser, and east of Coors from La Orilla to Paseo del Norte.

We have divided the rest of Taylor Ranch into six manageable sections for patrols. As soon as we get more volunteers we will cover the areas mentioned above.
